TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

This is to confirm that Letecká amatérská asociace České republiky (Light Aircraft Association of the Czech Republic), place of business: Praha 10, Ke Kablu 289, IČO 48137481, is authorized by the Ministry of Transport (Decision No. 138/2013-220-LPR/2), pursuant to Act No. 49/1997 Coll., on civil aviation and on amendment and supplement of Act No. 455/1991 Coll., on engaging in trade (The Trades Licensing Act), as subsequently amended, to execute delegated exercise of state administration in sport flying equipment.

Sport flying equipment covers the following: paragliders, hang-gliders, ultralight and motorized ultralight gliders, ultralight airplanes¹, motorized paragliders, motorized and non-motorized gyroplanes² and ultralight helicopters.

Light Aircraft Association of the Czech Republic is authorized by the Ministry of Transport mainly to the following:

- to check the airworthiness of the sport flying equipment and issue the technical certificate of sport flying equipment;
- to assign registration plate to sport flying equipment;
- to keep evidence of sport flying equipment and their users, including registration;
- to specify the conditions for the selection and approval of the take-off and landing areas of sport flying equipment;
- to issue certificates of competence to users of sport flying equipment;
- to supervise the activities of users of sport flying equipment.
